- ◆ providing a forum for cross-cultural and creative theological engagement with the Wesleyan corpus in worship and study.

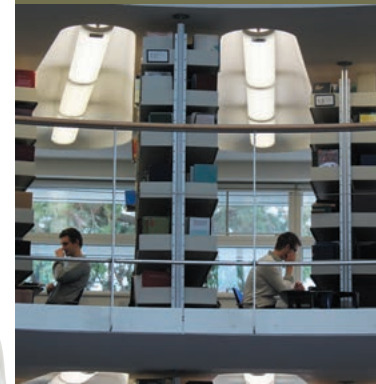
Shorter, reflective articles, reviews of books and films and creative content are also invited.

Doctoral Level Study

Doctorates are suitable for graduates of any age who have completed an MA and give you the opportunity to study and be taught in an area of your choice in depth.

Focus on the DProf

The Professional Doctorate in Practical Theology is a research degree for practitioners of any age who wish to develop research that will transform their own practice and that of their organisation.

You can take the degree over 4 to 5 years travelling to Cambridge for bi-monthly supervision and seminars and an annual summer school.

Recent research from DProf students has included:

- ◆ **Seeking the ‘C’ in the ‘Y’. Discerning the meaning of the Christian basis in the English YMCA**
- ◆ **The role of the creative arts in clergy wellbeing**
- ◆ **Storied Places, Embodied Stories – an exploration of urban pioneer ministry**

Masters Level Study

If you have a first-class or good upper-second class undergraduate degree in Theology or a related field, an MPhil, MA, PGDip or PGCert in Theology, Ministry and Mission might suit you. They have all been developed for those in ordained ministry or who are seeking preparation for forms of lay ministry who want to grow and reflect on their current practice.

The MA includes the same taught component as the Postgraduate Diploma but with the addition of a dissertation. If you are unable to make as much of a time commitment then you could consider taking the Postgraduate Certificate, which is made up of the first three modules of the Diploma.
