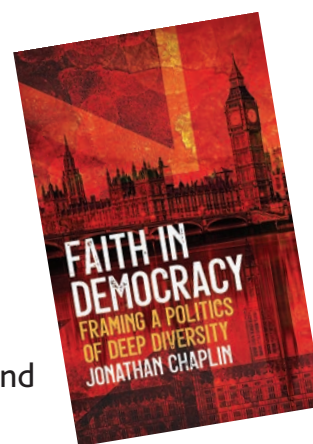
Constitutional Democracy – A Global Christian Imperative
